Naturescape Oxford

Flo's: The Place in the Park has begun work on their new <u>Naturescape project</u>, which will transform the old mini golf site into an outdoor space for the community. Your Community Your Choice

<u>Sovereign Housing</u> have chosen Abingdon as one of two sites to pilot an a new initiative known as participatory budgeting – a process where local residents in Abingdon can decide how to allocate £20k funding for environmental projects.
